THE LOVE AND JUSTICE OF GOD

Part 7 of Knowing God. Isaiah 65:1-7. Peter Foxwell. Cornerstone Church. March 17, 2024.

A CHALLENGING CONCEPT

It can feel difficult to reconcile God's love and justice.

We may feel God is loving but not just or vice versa.

The reality is that God is always loving and just.

Love and justice are the essence or nature of God.

ISAIAH 65:1-7

The context and text of Isaiah 65.

- God was disappointed with his people. They rebelled against him. They embraced pagan religion.
- God Is Love: I was ready to be sought by those who did not ask for me; I was ready to be found by those who did not seek me. I said, "Here I am, here I am," to a nation that was not called by my name. 2 I spread out my hands all the day to a rebellious people, who walk in a way that is not good, following their own devices; 3 a people who provoke me to my face continually, sacrificing in gardens and making offerings on bricks; 4 who sit in tombs, and spend the night in secret places; who eat pig's flesh, and broth of tainted meat is in their vessels; 5 who say, "Keep to yourself, do not come near me, for I am too holy for you."
- God Is Justice: These are a smoke in my nostrils, a fire that burns all the day. 6 Behold, it is written before me: "I will not keep silent, but I will repay; I will indeed repay into their lap 7 both your iniquities and your fathers' iniquities together, says the LORD; because they made offerings on the mountains and insulted me on the hills, I will measure into their lap payment for their former deeds."

GOD IS LOVE

God's love is revealed in his invitation to the people who run from him.

- See Isaiah 65:1-2.
- God invites rebels to repent of their sins and return to him.
- The Lord Jesus Christ was definite about this:

Luke 13:34 (ESV) O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing!

Who was not willing? Jesus or the people?

God's love is revealed in his patience with the people who replace him.

- See Isaiah 65:2-5.
- The people invented new gods to serve and worship.
- They deserved fire and brimstone. But the Lord waited patiently.
 - 2 Peter 3:9 (ESV) The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance.
- God is waiting patiently for you to repent of sins and return to him.

GOD IS JUST

The Bible explicitly describes God as just.

- Moses praised the Lord and said:
 - Deuteronomy 32:4 (ESV) "The Rock, his work is perfect, for all his ways are justice. A God of faithfulness and without iniquity, just and upright is he.
- God always does what is right and fair. That's his justice.

God reveals his justice in three ways:

- It is a rule of life for us to follow: Isaiah 1:16-17.
- It is the renewal of all things: 2 Peter 3:13.
- It is retribution: Acts 17:30-31.

Isaiah 65:5-7 offers insights into God's retributive justice.

- God's retribution is personal verse 5. Sin is like blowing smoke in his face.
- God's retribution is perpetual verse 6. It's all day long.
- God's retribution is payment verses 6-7. Jesus will judge the living and dead (John 5:25-29; 1 Peter 4:1-6).

Acts 17:30-31 (ESV) The times of ignorance God over- looked, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent, 31 because he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

WHERE LOVE AND JUSTICE MEET

The crucifixion of Christ is where God's love and justice meet.

- See 1 John 4:10; Isaiah 53:4-5; Romans 3:25-26.
- The Lord Jesus endured the justice of God against us as a display of the love of God for us.

GOD'S INVITATION TO ALL

All day long, God is speaking, "Here I am, here I am."

- His arms are open wide to embrace you. Turn from sin to Jesus.
- Receive his cleansing, forgiveness, and freedom.
