THE QUADRENNIAL ELECTION YEAR PANIC FEST

We must stay focused on the one true God.

- We're prone to wander into idolatry and trust in false gods.
- The cure for idolatry is to believe and live in light of God's supremacy over every thing.
- Judges Chapter 6 is an excellent place to study God's supremacy.

THE CONTEXT OF JUDGES

Judges explores the bittersweet history of the baby nation of Israel.

• Repeated cycles of unfaithfulness, God's severe discipline, the people's desperation, and God's gracious salvation through judges - unlikely heroes.

THREE LESSONS ON THE SUPREMACY OF GOD

Lesson One: Avoid Idolatry - verses 1-6.

- Israel wandered into idolatry.
 - 1 The people of Israel did what was evil in the sight of the LORD ...
- The Lord responded with severe discipline verses 1-6a.
 - 6 And Israel was brought very low because of Midian.
- Israel responded in desperation.
 - 6 And the people of Israel cried out for help to the LORD.
- When God's people turned from God, he gave them what they wanted.

 When individuals or nations turn from the Lord they get what they want - a godless life or nation.

Lesson Two: When Chaos reigns, Pray for God's Intervention - verses 7-24.

- The Lord heard their prayer for help, and answered in three ways:
- 1. The Lord sent a preacher verses 7-10:
 - 10 And I said to you, 'I am the LORD your God; you shall not fear the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell.' But you have not obeyed my voice."
- 2. The Lord called a peasant verses 11-14:
 - 12 And the angel of the LORD appeared to him and said to him, "The LORD is with you, O mighty man of valor." God is always good to us; he cannot be anything else.
- 3. The Lord revealed his presence verses 16-24:
 - 16 And the LORD said to him, "But I will be with you, and you shall strike the Midianites as one man."
- God doesn't need us to be extraordinary.
- · When he calls us, he renames us. Gideon was called "mighty man of valor."
- God can change the direction of our lives and our nation with a word.

Lesson Three: Partner with God in Doing the Right Things - verses 25-27.

Gideon's family farm was a center for Baal and Asherah worship.

Baal: The Hebrew noun ba'al means 'master', 'possessor' or 'husband'. ... He was Hadad, ... the storm-god, the most important deity in the Canaanite pantheon ...

Asherah: A Canaanite mother-goddess, a goddess of the sea and the consort of ... Baal (e.g. Judges. 3:7).

- Gideon partnered with the Lord to tear down the altars of Baal-Asherah.
 - 27 So Gideon took ten men of his servants and did as the LORD had told him.
- Stand firm in your Christian faith and do not concede anything to rival gods, pagan cultural movements, or ungodly political agendas.
- Be a peaceful, loving presence in the community. Don't apologize for your biblical stance, share the gospel, never be ashamed of following Jesus.
- The result: see what happened when Gideon did the right thing: a cultural revolution and the restoration of his idolatrous faith verses 28-32.

BELIEVE IN AND LIVE UNDER THE SUPREMACY OF GOD

Our nation is similar to Israel - idolatrous and oppressed.

- But we trust in God, who is supreme over the chaos.
- Don't panic, don't hide in shame, step out of the wine press and face down the altars of the false gods in your life and community
- Stand up for Jesus. He is supreme. He never fails.
 - Revelation 11:15(ESV) "The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ, and he shall reign forever and ever."
